

Get involved in the School Banking program.

Glasshouse Christian College is excited to offer the Commonwealth Bank School Banking program to all students.

School Banking is a fun, interactive and engaging way for young Australians to learn about money and develop good savings habits. Children who deposit money into their Youthsaver account through School Banking earn Dollarmites tokens, which they can save up and redeem for exciting rewards.

School Banking is also a great fundraiser for our College. Our College receives \$5 when a student makes their first ever School Banking deposit and 5% on every deposit made through the school (to a maximum of \$10 per individual deposit). **In 2016 our school raised more than \$1300 through the School Banking Program!**

Money raised through the School Banking Program in our first year was donated to the Isiseko Educare Centre which is situated in a Township in Cape Town, South Africa. The funds were used to aid in the construction of buildings for the centre as they were previously operating from a make-shift shack and did not qualify for any government funding.

Getting involved in School Banking is easy!

All you need to get involved in the School Banking program is a Commonwealth Bank Youthsaver account. You can open an account for your child in one of two ways:

1. Online (recommended option)

Visit commbank.com.au/schoolbanking and click on the link to open a Youthsaver account. Once you have completed this process, and you wish to start banking immediately, **please bring a printout of the email confirmation from Commonwealth Bank to the GCC Library on one of the following days so that we can issue you with a deposit book and Dollarmites deposit wallet.** Alternatively, you can wait for your deposit book and Dollarmites deposit wallet to be sent to you in the post.

2. In branch

Visit a Commonwealth Bank branch with identification for yourself and your child, like a driver's licence and birth certificate.

If your child has an existing Commonwealth Bank Youthsaver account they can start banking straight away. They just need to bring their deposit in every week on School Banking day using their Dollarmites deposit wallet.

School Banking day is **Wednesday**. Each week you need to bring in your Dollarmites deposit wallet, containing your **completed** deposit slip as well as your monies to deposit.
